Guv promises colposcope, cryo machine at Sahibganj

The machines are the first in the State and are very crucial for detection of cervical cancer and other serious diseases related to genital organs of women. Murmu said on the occasion that such camps organised by IMA Women Doctors' Wing are helping poor tribal and PTG women a lot. The camp was inaugurated by Health Minister Ramchandra Chandravanshi, Rajmahal MLA Anant Ojha and President of IMA Women Doctors' Wing Dr Bharti Kashyap on January 10. During the programme the Governor felicitated Dr Kashyap and praised the efforts of the IMA

Women Doctors' Wing.

She said that the IMA Women Doctors' Wing along with Health Department and IMA, Jharkhand have been regularly organising such free camps for detection and curbing of Cervical Cancer and Anemia prevention at different Sadar and Sub Divisional hospitals.

She said that the diseases are taking a serious toll on the health of women and the biggest reason of death due to cancer is cervical cancer in women in the country because of early marriage trend. The Governor praised the efforts of IMA Women Doctors' Wing for waging a war against cervical cancer, genital infections and anemia in the State.
